Dear K,

It was good seeing you last weekend.

Satan would call it something else. He is so reasonable and understanding about our shortcomings. Not about anyone else's, he'll make sure we see the sins of others alright.

Jesus however, by His presence, allows us to see our own sin.

How we react to this determines whether we go on to embrace Jesus or run away from Him.

Quite simply, Jesus has come as the answer to our sin, to my sin, to your sin. Sin that if left 'untreated' would result in an eternal separation from God.

God hates sin. With a vengeance. Sin is what separates us from Him.

We are all made in the image of God, to be with Him, to talk with Him, to interact with Him. God is love, and He sure loves us all.

But He can't look on sin. Problem.

God's solution was that He sent His Son, to be born as a man, the man Jesus of Nazareth.

Jesus was in the form of a man, but without sin.

He lived with a mam and dad, brothers and sisters.

He saw his 'father' die, worked as a carpenter, was just one of the guys in Nazareth. No halo.

But He came for one thing. To die for my sin, and your sin.

Jesus moves, I go with Him.

I know Jesus loves me and is committed to me.
